Parking/Getting Around Centenary

Parking is available in our lot, accessible from Washington Street, as well as on Main and Washington streets. Our lot includes designated Handicap spaces. Additional parking is available in a free municipal parking lot just two blocks past the church, on Main Street.

Centenary offers three entrances accessible from Main Street that lead to the church sanctuary, classrooms and offices.

Both the middle courtyard and Washington Street entrances are Handicap accessible. The Washington Street entrance offers quick access to the church elevator, Fellowship Hall and 1st floor classrooms. The 5th Street entrance is offset between 1st and 2nd floors.

Mid-Week Programs for Adults


Both Bible-based and topical studies are offered to adults on Wednesday evenings, from 6:30-7:30 p.m. Centenary's choir rehearses at 7:45 and welcomes new members.

Vibrant Children's & Youth Ministries

Centenary's Children's Ministries offer a safe space for children to be active and learn about God's love. In addition to Sunday morning, activities are planned on Wednesday evenings. A meal is served at 6 p.m., and kid's worship and education takes place from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m. in the sanctuary.

Centenary Youth Fellowship is for middle and high school students (Grades 6 through 12). Students meet on a varied schedule, currently on Sunday evenings at 6 to 8 p.m. for fun, learning and community service activities.

Volunteer leaders for children's and youth programs are Safe Sanctuaries trained.



Current Sunday School Classes and Small Groups

Friendship Class

Ages ranging from 40 to 90, this class uses a variety of traditional curriculum and focuses heavily on Biblical teachings. Located on the 2nd floor, across from the elevator.

Sanctuary Class

The class is comprised of both working and retired adults, and volunteers rotate to teach the varied curriculum. Located on the 2nd floor, in Room 206.

Chapel Class

This group of young adults explores a varied curriculum. Located on the 2nd floor, in the Chapel.

Seekers Class

Topical studies are the focus for this class comprised of a variety of adult ages. Located on the 3rd floor.

Bible Study Class

From college age to retired adults, singles and couples, this class focuses on in-depth Biblical studies. Located in the Youth Building.

Lost Sheep

Both young and middle-aged adults participate in this class, with topical curriculum and teaching responsibilities shared by class members. Located in the Youth Building.

Middle & High School Classes

Age-appropriate curriculum varies and classes are discussion-based, led by adult leaders. Located on the 2nd floor of the Youth Building.

Pre-K-5th Grade Classes

Interactive, age-level curriculum is Bible-based and focused on teaching stories of the Old & New Testament. Experienced teachers are supported by church members who float between classes to provide an extra hand. Located on the 1st floor.

Nursery

Experienced nursery staff are ready to provide loving care for your little ones (infants to preschool aged) while you worship or attend Sunday School.
