

It doesn't take long to see that the world feels unsettled. The headlines remind us daily of conflict, division, and loss. Fear seems to hang in the air; fear of the future, fear for our safety, fear that things may never be the same again. And yet, in the middle of it all, God's people are still called to give thanks.

Thankfulness is not pretending everything is fine. It's remembering that even when the world trembles, God does not. Gratitude reorients our hearts from what's wrong around us to what's right within God's care. The psalmist writes, "Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good; His steadfast love endures forever" (Psalm 107:1). That's not a suggestion for when life is easy, it's a declaration of faith for when life is hard.

When we practice gratitude, we begin to see the fingerprints of God in ordinary places: the kindness of a friend, the laughter of a child, the beauty of fall leaves, the warmth of a church family that prays for one another. Gratitude doesn't erase fear, but it does shrink it. It reminds us that God's faithfulness outlasts every storm.

So as we move toward Thanksgiving, let's be a people who choose to give thanks not because everything is perfect, but because God is present. Let's praise Him for the ways He is working through our church, through acts of service, through moments of worship, and through the quiet assurance that we belong to Him.

Even in a world full of fear and upheaval, we have every reason to say, "Thanks be to God."

Assistance Program Update

As the seasons begin to change and the air turns crisp, our Centenary Assistance Program continues to be a steady presence for families in need throughout our community. September was another month of faithful service and meaningful impact, made possible through your generosity, prayers, and support.

During the month of September, we assisted 158 households, providing food for 347 individuals. Each number represents a real person or family—a reminder of the importance of this ministry. Compared to this time last year, we are 74 households and 242 people ahead in the number of neighbors we've been able to serve. The need continues to grow, and thanks to your support, our response continues to grow with it.

While food assistance remains the heart of our program, we also provide limited financial help for rent, utilities, and other urgent needs when possible. September was lighter than usual in this area. We received 13 requests for financial assistance, but only two were able to be helped. The remaining requests either did not meet eligibility requirements or were unable to provide the necessary paperwork. We continue to do our best to guide each family through the process while remaining faithful stewards of the resources entrusted to us.

We're excited to share that Centenary has been awarded a \$10,000 grant from the 100 Women Who Care organization in Shelby County! While we have not yet received the funds, we are prayerfully discerning how best to use them to help those most in need. We are deeply grateful for this generous support and remain committed to using every dollar responsibly to make a meaningful difference.

Looking ahead, we anticipate an influx of families seeking help in November as EBT benefits may remain on hold until the government reopens and federal SNAP funds are released. Many area organizations have had to reevaluate or limit their programs, so we expect to see more requests for Thanksgiving assistance than usual. How Centenary will answer this call is still being finalized, but we are confident that, together, we will find a faithful way forward.

Plans are also underway for our annual Christmas meal outreach. This year, we're partnering with Kroger to provide 200 meal bags for local families! Kroger has been collecting the side items since September, and Centenary will purchase 200 small Private Selection hams and turkeys to complete each bag. In past years, we were able to provide 50 meal bags—including a \$25 gift card—for around \$1,300. Thanks to this new partnership and community effort, we'll be able to serve 200 families for about \$2,000 total!

If you would like to help with our Thanksgiving or Christmas outreach, please include a note on your check or envelope marked "Assistance Program Holiday Meals." Every gift—no matter the size—helps bring nourishment, hope, and dignity to a neighbor in need.

We remain deeply grateful for our volunteers, donors, and community partners—including Farmers Feeding Families, Dare to Care, and Kroger—whose ongoing support makes this ministry possible. Together, we are truly living out Christ's call to "feed my sheep" and to love our neighbors in both word and action.


