Assistance Program

Where has the time gone?

It's hard to believe we're already heading into May! As many of you know, I'm usually a month behind in reporting assistance statistics since I prepare the next month's newsletter in advance. So, here's the update for March and the first quarter of the year.

March Report

In March, we received 17 applications for financial assistance. Of those, we were able to fulfill 11 requests, serving 19 individuals at a total cost of \$1,328.89.

For the 6 requests we couldn't fulfill:

- 4 lacked the required paperwork
- 2 applicants were not eligible at the time of their request

In terms of food assistance, we distributed 136 bags of food, feeding 306 people.

First Quarter Summary

During the first quarter, Centenary received 46 requests for assistance. We were able to fulfill 25 of those requests, totaling \$3,443.48 in support.

Of the 21 requests not fulfilled:

- 14 requests (approximately 30%) came from individuals who had already received assistance within the past 12 months and were not yet eligible for further support
- The remaining 7 were due to incomplete paperwork, failure to return with a letter of intent, or not completing a referred financial counseling course

Notably, a majority of this year's assistance requests have come from individuals who have previously received help from us.

Centenary also distributed 397 bags of food, feeding 887 individuals in our community. We spent \$2,116.86 on food supplies and additional items not donated by Dare to Care. This food assistance program is open to all Shelby County residents and is only possible because of the generous support of our congregation and community partners. Thank you!

The assistance program is open to ALL Shelby County residents.

Assistance days are Tuesdays and Thursdays 9:00am-2:00pm.

For financial assistance people must bring: Photo ID, proof of income, current disconnect notice or lease agreement.

Assistance is available once in a 12month time frame.

Food assistance can be picked up every other week. Just need an ID showing Shelby County residency.


